

Communities That HEALIntervention Increases Naloxone Availability

The Problem

Naloxone, the medication that can reverse an opioid-related overdose as it is happening, is often not available to people who need it. Supplying community members with naloxone will reduce opioid overdose deaths.

The Goal

Increase the availability of overdose education and naloxone in communities with the highest rates of overdose deaths by reaching people at risk of an overdose.

The <u>Communities That HEAL</u> included community-based approaches to increasing naloxone availability in communities, such as distributing naloxone at community events and installing naloxone cabinets in places in the community where overdoses happen.

79%

more units of naloxone were distributed in communities that received the intervention.

Broad availability of naloxone is urgently needed in communities with high rates of opioid overdose deaths.

The Communities that HEAL intervention empowers community members to address the opioid overdose crisis by selecting strategies appropriately matched to their needs. This study shows that local governments and public health officials must consider a variety of community-based strategies to increase naloxone availability in their communities.

It is important for other local governments and public health leaders to consider, select, and use a variety of strategies to reach people at risk of an overdose with naloxone and overdose eduction.
